From an early age, **Shoilee Banerjee** discovered the necessity of bringing awareness to mental illnesses, as she saw her peers face a new mental health crisis, spurred by the 21st century world. For some, these illnesses were mild, but for others, debilitating.

Now, Banerjee is a mental health advocate and fights to destignatize depression and anxiety in her Indian community. At the moment, Shoilee studies Public Health at the University of Massachusetts and works as an infectious disease researcher at Massachusetts General Hospital—the same hospital where she was born.

She has raised awareness for marginalized groups through her activism and has worked with politicians such as Congressman Jim McGovern, presidential candidate Tulsi Gabbard, and the Prime Minister of India. She is also an accomplished Indian classical dancer and graduated two years ago from the prestigious Triveni School of Dance.

Shoilee Banerjee continues to advocate for those who have a hard time finding their own voice and for those who have already found theirs.
